

Import taxes on solar systems in the Cook Islands

What are the responsibilities of a Cook Islands importer?

Import declarations (bringing goods in). Export declarations (sending goods out). Import concessions or exemptions (reduces importation costs - import / duty). We promote the Cook Islands international trade and collect revenue. We investigate illegal activities and prosecute where necessary.

How do I get my goods cleared in the Cook Islands?

Imported goods can be cleared prior to or upon arrival by the submission of an import entry or declaration through the services of a licensed Customs Brokers here in the Cook Islands or a Customs Declarant. If unsure whether your goods require Customs clearance, please contact us:

Can a craft be imported into the Cook Islands?

Any craft built in the Cook Islands, not being imported as cargo that has not previously been entered for export. Any stores on board crafts that is declared on a stores list and the stores must be kept in a secure area. Some goods are prohibited, and approval cannot be given to import them into the country.

We currently have a few approved Customs Broker Agencies both in Rarotonga and in Aitutaki. What is customs Online Banking details? COOK ISLANDS Tariffs and Value Added Tax Guide. Tariffs refer to the taxes levied by COOK ISLANDS on goods entering or leaving its borders in accordance with local laws. Regardless of the declared purpose of the items you send, COOK ISLANDS customs can determine the import duties to be levied on those items based on factors such as their value and quantity.

Import VAT is chargeable on all goods (including motor vehicles) imported into Cook Islands, even though the transaction has been conducted offshore and the purchase price may already incorporate a local value-added or sales tax component.

VAT is a tax on goods and services supplied in the Cook Islands by VAT-registered persons. It may also apply to imported goods and certain imported services. It is charged and accounted for at a rate of 15%. Anyone who carries on a taxable activity, or who intends to do so from a definite date, may register for VAT.

Import taxes are imposed depending on the age of the used vehicle. For motorcycles, the duty rate ranges from 0-150%. For motorcars, the duty rate ranges from 0-120%. ... 12.5% VAT is applicable to all goods or motor

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vehicles imported in the Cook Islands depending on the Customs value of the vehicle, duty, and international freight and insurance.

This ensures that Cook Islands exported goods for trade is applicable for preferential treatment under the PICTA Agreement. If applicable, exported goods may not incur import charges in the country of import. It is legal to import small supplies of Prescription Medicines for personal use into the Cook Islands as long as you have a letter or a copy of the prescription from your doctor.
