Do I need a power adapter in Cuba?

If you are visiting Cuba from the United States, you should bring a power adapter because US Type A or B outlets may not be readily available. If your device runs on 110 volts or is dual voltage, and the plug fits in a Cuban power outlet, it will work without a plug adapter in Cuba.
